Be Ripe with Jesus

I was looking at the table of contents for the 1870 Book of Discipline for the "Methodist Episcopal Church, South." The entry for section three reads "The Ministration of Baptism to such as are of **Riper** Years." That terminology is just not used anymore.

We've heard the phrase "be right with Jesus." We should use the phrase "be ripe with Jesus." What do I mean? Don't remain green by failing to mature to good useful fruit. And don't become rotten by thinking your usefulness is long gone. Whatever your age you can "be ripe with Jesus."

Many years ago when I was teenager, and that was many, many years ago, another teenage friend and I were cleaning off this land for a retired minister. We filled this 45 gallon can with trash. Now, we just needed to place it in the back of the truck and haul it off.

We struggled, grunted, and gasped for air after several attempts to lift the can up onto the tailgate of the truck. Finally we just sat on the tailgate on either side of that can, still on the ground. We were exhausted.

The 78 year old retired preacher walked up. He asked "What are you fellows doing?" We responded "Trying to get this heavy can in the back of the truck." He reached with one hand to grab the lip of that can and threw it in the back of that truck like a throw pillow. Brother Lee didn't have to preach "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:13) He just did it to the amazement of all that witnessed it!

We are in the fourth month of a new year 2017, although its newness may have worn off, and many will fall away from their New Year's resolutions. The vow to become "physically fit" is usually top on that list. Friends in Jesus, we must remain committed to be "spiritually fit."

In a letter to his young assistant Timothy, the Apostle Paul wrote: "Exercise your-self toward godliness" (1 Timothy 4:7). The Apostle compared physical fitness with spiritual fitness. "Take time and trouble to keep yourself spiritually fit. Bodily fitness has a certain value, but spiritual fitness is essential, both for this present life and for the life to come" (1 Timothy 4:8).

Help the Pike County Chaplains Association Saturday April 29th








5th Sunday April 30th Singing Service and Covered Lunch "Special Recognition of Brundidge Police Department"
