Special Called Conference February 23rd Through 26th

In Saint Louis, 868 delegates will gather to decide (hopefully) the United Methodist Church's response to the movement within our denomination to have homosexual marriage ceremonies in our churches and practicing homosexuals serving as clergy (including bishops). The Southeastern Jurisdiction is composed of 188 delegates and the Alabama-West Florida Conference will have 28 in attendance.

It would be in our best interest to see a conclusive decision at the end of the session. The Bible and <u>The Book of Discipline</u> appear to be violated without any punitive results by many in the UMC. This has created a chasm over doctrinal differences and discredited the authority of <u>The Book of Discipline</u>.

John Wesley created the "trust clause" to discourage preachers who taught false doctrine from leading congregations away from the Methodist denomination, taking their assets. It would be good to see that a generous allowance for any congregation to leave the UMC with their physical and financial assets will come from the Special General Conference. This would discount that the "trust clause" is being used as a manipulative tool to keep congregations in the denomination solely for financial support of the institution.

We, the congregation of Brundidge United Methodist Church, will determine what response is necessary after the Special General Conference. Be in prayer. A post general conference meeting will be March 7th, 6 p.m., at First United Methodist Church of Montgomery. All are welcome. Let me know that you intend to go to this very important meeting. 
