

The Best Valentine is to Obey the Lord Jesus

Jesus said "If you love me, keep my commands." (John 14:15) This is the test and evidence of your love for Christ. Our natural human tendency is to go our own way: "In those days Israel had no king; all the people did whatever seemed right in their own eyes." (Judges 21:25)

The best Valentine to Christ is to say "I'll obey Your Word, Jesus, and consciously make your commands the starting point for everything I do in my life." What has happened is we take off to handle our lives in our way to stumble then run back to Christ's commandments for help.

Unfortunately, some have knowingly disobeyed Christ's commandments for personal convenience and gain in this earthly life: this harms Christians and our Christian witness. It harms Christians who don't see the need to obey the Lord's commands when their leaders fail to do so. The unsaved see "Christians" not living on a higher plain of righteousness to just chase after worldly things with their same enthusiasm.

This February I encourage everybody to read these two Scripture passages and make the Lord's standards stated in these verses your "starting gate". John 13:34-35 and 1 Corinthians 13. "Love one another as I have loved you" and "Love is patient, love is kind" are words to obey.

We are not called to label this disobedience as "these are the signs of the times" and we can't stop them. Jesus told the Ephesus church "Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first." (Revelation 2:4) We should make a Valentine vow to Jesus "To the end of the age I will make You, Jesus, my first love, and make Your love visible to the world."

To the very end I will make Jesus' love a powerful presence in this world because Jesus' commandments will be my first and my faithful commitment in my life. First John 2:5 "But if anyone obeys His Word, love for God is truly made complete in them."
